Amphoras found in Cyprus by the Swedes

In connection with the fragments of evidently a Cypriot jar found in TT, Well at 32/1A (3rd C last $\frac{1}{4}$ of 5th BC), two lead photostats made of parts of plates LVII, LXIII, LXVII, LXIX, of SCE IV, 2. These were made in 2 copies, of which one is here attached, while the other has been cut up for shape-cards for the amples file. On the attached copy, are writing class names on jar to indicate where cards are being filed.

Dear Mr. Gjerstad,

A general study I have undertaken of jar stamps and stamped jars is going to bring me to Cyprus. I have seen some Rhodian jars in the museum in Nicosia some of which I believe are yours. I wonder if I might have your permission to study and photograph these, and use them finally in a publication? I should also be very grateful for photographs of any Rhodian jars you may have in your collection in Stockholm, for instance of Marion Tomb 1, no.1 if it is there. (No picture of this is given in your publication apparently.) I remember seeing one Rhodian jar in your apotheke there, but according to my notes on the stamps it was not that one. Unfortunately I did not take down its number.

A publication of Lapithos 1931 Tomb 6A which contained the Minoan vase is coming out I hope in the June number of the American Journal of Archaeology. (It is nearly druckfertig, but there is question of space in the Journal.) I wish very much I could have been in Philadelphia when you looked over the pottery from this and other of our tombs.

Shall we see you in Greece this spring?
